Compline from the Book of Common Prayer
(Larger Print)

In order to accommodate the limitations of technology, Compline has been set for 6 voices. Voice 1 prays most of the parts typically assigned to the Officiant. Voice 2 prays the parts of the People. Voice 3 prays the parts of the Officiant and the People. In order to allow more people to participate, the longer Psalms are prayed by all 6 voices in turn. For the same reason, the short chapter (the Bible verse) and each of the two Collects are prayed by different voices (Voice 4, 5, and 6 respectively). Rubrics have been adjusted to accommodate prayer on Zoom and the pattern of prayer developed by those who regularly participate in Tuesday evening Compline.

Voice 6 invites those present to offer prayers of intercessions and thanksgivings. Our practice is to keep these very brief to maintain a prayerful atmosphere.

All participants who are not assigned a number (voice) are invited to mute their microphone and silently pray with Voices 2 and 3. All participants are welcome to participate in the intercessions and thanksgivings.

If less than 6 people are present, more than one voice may be assigned to a participant.

After all voices are assigned, the service will begin with the ringing of a bell and one minute of silence. The service will end with the ringing of a bell.

From the 1979 Book of Common Prayer (pages 127-135)

1 The Lord Almighty grant us a peaceful night and a perfect end. *Amen.*

1 Our help is in the Name of the Lord;

2 The maker of heaven and earth.

1 Let us confess our sins to God.

Silence may be kept.

3 Almighty God, our heavenly Father:

We have sinned against you,

through our own fault,

in thought, and word, and deed,

and in what we have left undone.

For the sake of your Son our Lord Jesus Christ,

forgive us all our offenses;

and grant that we may serve you

in newness of life,

to the glory of your Name. Amen.

Except in Lent, add Alleluia.

One or more of the following Psalms are sung or said. The verses are said in rotation (voices 1-6 in numerical order) for as many verses as are in the Psalm. A Celtic knot (☘) indicates that the Psalm is completed and the next voice is Voice 3 with the Gloria Patri

Voice 4 selects and reads one of the following passages of Scripture

Voice 5 selects and reads one of the Collects, or, if it is Saturday, reads the Collect appointed for Saturdays

5 Be our light in the darkness, O Lord, and in your great mercy defend us from all perils and dangers of this night; for the love of your only Son, our Savior Jesus Christ. *Amen.*

Be present, O merciful God, and protect us through the hours of this night, so that we who are wearied by the changes and chances of this life may rest in your eternal changelessness; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

Look down, O Lord, from your heavenly throne, and illumine this night with your celestial brightness; that by night as by day your people may glorify your holy Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

Visit this place, O Lord, and drive far from it all snares of the enemy; let your holy angels dwell with us to preserve us in peace; and let your blessing be upon us always; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

A Collect for Saturdays

We give you thanks, O God, for revealing your Son Jesus Christ to us by the light of his resurrection: Grant that as we sing your glory at the close of this day, our joy may abound in the morning as we celebrate the Paschal mystery; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

Voice 6 selects and reads one of the following prayers

6 Keep watch, dear Lord, with those who work, or watch, or weep this night, and give your angels charge over those who sleep. Tend the sick, Lord Christ; give rest to the weary, bless the dying, soothe the suffering, pity the afflicted, shield the joyous; and all for your love's sake. *Amen.*

O God, your unfailing providence sustains the world we live in and the life we live: Watch over those, both night and day, who work while others sleep, and grant that we may never forget that our common life depends upon each other's toil; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

6 *Silence may be kept, and then Voice 6 invites intercessions and thanksgivings be offered, silently or out loud.*

3 Guide us waking, O Lord, and guard us sleeping; that awake we may watch with Christ, and asleep we may rest in peace.

In Easter Season, add Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.

Lord, you now have set your servant free *

to go in peace as you have promised;

For these eyes of mine have seen the Savior, *

whom you have prepared for all the world to see:

A Light to enlighten the nations, *

and the glory of your people Israel.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: *

as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.

Guide us waking, O Lord, and guard us sleeping; that awake we may watch with Christ, and asleep we may rest in peace.

In Easter Season, add Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.

1 The almighty and merciful Lord, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, bless us and keep us. *Amen.*
