A Litany for Christmas and Epiphany on Tuesdays

A Litany for the Season of Christmas, the Epiphany, and the Season after the Epiphany

The form of the Great Litany has been used as the foundation for this litany. A section from St. Patrick's Breastplate has been adapted to communal prayers for this litany. The Petitions from the Collects for Christmas, Epiphany, and the Season after the Epiphany are used as the primary petitions for grace to live fully into the reality of Christ's first coming and in joyful anticipation of his second coming. The Lorica of Fursa, (from www.acollectionofprayers.com), translated by Paul C. Stratman, adapted to communal prayers for this litany and is used, in this form, by the translator's permission. For intercessory prayers for the wider community and world, Form IV Prayers of the People (BCP 388-9) are used.

In order to accommodate the limitations of technology, this Litany is arranged for 12 voices. Even numbered voices pray the responses of the people. Please note that the voices are heard in more than one portion of the Litany.

All participants who are not assigned a number in a given portion of the liturgy are invited to either mute their microphone or silently pray with the even numbered voice (the voice of the people).

If less than 12 people are present, more than one voice may be assigned to participants.

After all voices are assigned, the service will begin with the ringing of a bell and one minute of silence. The service will end with the ringing of a bell.

I. voices 1 and 2
