A Litany for Living into Our Baptism through The Way of Love

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The form of The Great Litany (BCP 148-155) has been used as the foundation for this litany. A section from St. Patrick's Breastplate has also been adapted to communal prayers for this litany (The Hymnal 1982, #370). Prayers for the Candidates in The Baptismal Covenant (BCP 305-6) have been modified to focus the petitions on this community of baptized persons in prayer. The definitions of the seven parts of The Way of Love: Practices for Jesus-Centered Life (https://www.episcopalchurch.org/way-of-love/) have been adapted as petitions. The Lorica of Fursa, (from www.acollectionofprayers.com), translated by Paul C. Stratman, is adapted to communal prayers for this litany and is adapted and used by the translator's permission. For intercessory prayers for the wider community and world, Form IV Prayers of the People (BCP 388-9) are used.

In order to accommodate the limitations of technology, this Litany is arranged for 12 voices. Even numbered voices pray the responses of the people. Please note that the voices are heard in more than one portion of the Litany.

All participants who are not assigned a number in a given portion of the liturgy are invited to either mute their microphones or silently pray with the even-numbered voices (the voice of the people).

If less than 12 people are present, more than one voice may be assigned to participants.

After all voices are assigned, the service will begin with the ringing of a bell and one minute of silence. The service will end with the ringing of a bell.
