A Litany for Creation Care

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This Litany was composed by a professed member of The Anamchara Fellowship and is used by The Episcopal Church of the Transfiguration in Lake St. Louis, Missouri, with permission.

Following in the tradition of Celtic Christianity, this Litany calls us to recognize our place in creation – part of God's good creation with the responsibility to live in harmony with the rest of God's creatures.

In order to accommodate the limitations of technology, this Litany is arranged for 12 voices. Even numbered voices pray the responses of the people. Please note that the voices are heard in more than one portion of the Litany.

All participants who are not assigned a number in a given portion of the liturgy are invited to either mute their microphone or silently pray with the even numbered voice (the voice of the people).

If less than 12 people are present, more than one voice may be assigned to participants.

After all voices are assigned, the service will begin with the ringing of a bell and one minute of silence. The service will end with the ringing of a bell.

Note: The Anamchara Fellowship (AF) is a canonically-recognized Christian Community in the Episcopal Church. The Anamchara Fellowship uses the triquetra, an ancient Celtic symbol, as its logo in honor of the Fellowship's dedication to the Holy Trinity(see the cover of this litany).

I. voices 1 and 2 (recognizing our place in Creation)

- 9 We acknowledge we are leaving our children the results of our thoughtlessness, selfishness and ignorance
- 10 We are most heartily sorry
- 9 We acknowledge we need your help to set right that which we were given to protect
- 10 Holy Spirit, we ask that you give us ears to hear, and eyes to see, and understanding to continue that which was begun through you.
- VI. voices 11 and 12 (for recognition of what needs to be done)
- 11 Lord God, you give us Living Water,
- 12 Give us the wisdom to use water for the benefit of others and the awareness not to waste it
- 11 Lord God, You are the vine and we are the branches,
- 12 Give us the wisdom to use food for the benefit of others

- 11 Lord God, you gathered up the leftovers of loaves and fishes,
- 12 Give us the wisdom to share food with others and the awareness not to waste it.
- 11 Lord God, You are our Good Samaritan,
- 12 Give us the humility and compassion to be aware of all who are in need
- 11 Lord God, You shared with us the story of the widow's mite:
- 12 Help us resolve to share what you have given us with those who are in need.
